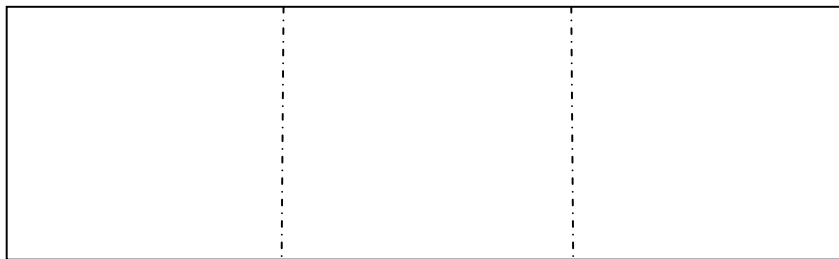




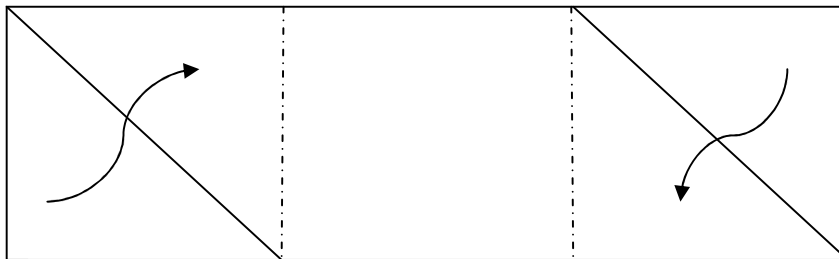
ORIGAMI FOLD BAG - made of a single length of cloth with no cutting and zero waste. This design has been used by many cultures over many years (from Africa to Japan and beyond) and has no clear attribution. This is simply my approach to making this versatile bag.

For durability I recommend lining with fabric – vintage kimono fabrics, hand-dyed silk etc, look fabulous. This fabric can also be added to reinforce the handle. Covered button closures, braids (made from same yarn as in hand woven cloth) are great to finish off the bag. Makes a lovely little purse for young girls or a large over the shoulder bag for carrying all sorts of things!



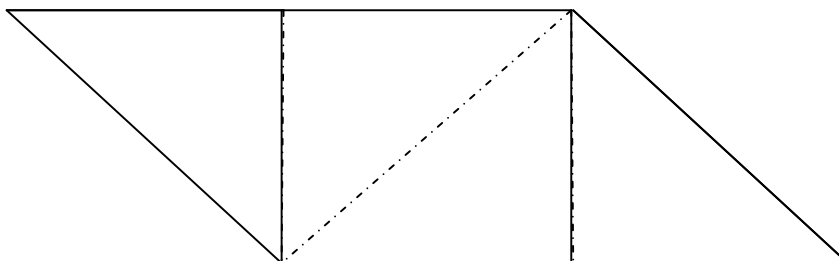
Rectangle dimensions length = 3 x width. This formula allows for various sized bags (e.g. 120 long x 40 wide). Cut lining fabric to same dimensions.

Stitch 3 sides together & turn right side out BEFORE making up bag.



FOLD lower left corner UP diagonally.

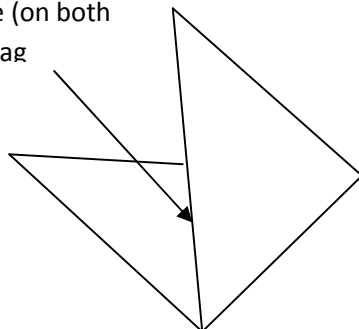
FOLD top right corner DOWN diagonally.



FOLD centre square UP on diagonal.

Note: Pin folded areas temporarily to secure in place.

Stitch line (on both sides of bag



Finished shape before stitching .

Pin then hand or machine stitch front and back of bag.
